Apunipima team members including Dr Mark Wenitong (right) and father and son team Robbie Corrie Snr & Jnr will be in Pormpuraaw on Wednesday hoping to capture community members willing to go on camera with their views on why we need to protect indigenous communities from Covid-19.



They said the team, who will be in Kowanyama tomorrow, was an opportunity for the community to have a say on what they want to hear and see around Covid-19.

Once finalised then videos will be shown on TV, social media all over Australia.

CEO Ganthi Kuppusamy thanked the team for inviting PPAC to join the project.

“Our participation is crucial as a community-controlled Aboriginal organisation,” she said.

“It is important to communicate COVID 19 information to the members of the community at a grass roots level so the community will be more aware of the symptoms and risks at all times.

“We all need to take this pandemic situation very seriously, we don’t

want to be sorry down the track.

“This is a great initiative from the Apunipima team and I’m certain the Covid-19 communication project will benefit the whole of community.”



Congratulations Meredith!



School awarded for transition success

Pormpuraaw State School has been announced as a far northern Queensland regional prize winner in the 2020 Showcase Award for Excellence in Rural and Remote Education for effectively transitioning primary students into high school.

Principal Anne Walsh said the school had a critical role in supporting students and their families for transition to boarding school and understanding the importance of succeeding in their first 100 days to reduce 'bounce back'.



"We're very excited to achieve this recognition," Ms Walsh said.

"Students living in Pormpuraaw face many barriers to successfully transitioning to secondary high school and world beyond Pormpuraaw."

She said the State Finalists from the seven school districts would be announced next month.

PPAC CEO Ganthi Kuppusamy congratulated the school for their hard work and success.

- Child Care services (Long Day Care) including, Child & Family Services (CAFS) and parenting support;
- Night Patrol Services; and,
- Women's Shelter services (Maantchangk Women's Shelter is open 52 weeks a year has a 7-days a week on-call service).
