

Award won for DV community work

"I'm so happy for what we've done in our community," Myrtle Foote says of hers and May Ballie's joint-award for making a significant local contribution to the awareness and prevention of domestic and family violence.

The two were announced as winners of the Alison Woolla Memorial Award last week at the 124th annual Local Government Association of Queensland (LGAQ) conference on the Gold Coast.

"I'd like to thank them very much for listening to our story," Myrtle said.

"What we did was very important, Alison Woolla, May and myself, we stood up for our people and our community and our children - our job was very important.

"I think it's amazing what we are doing today too, we've got the



counselling, Men's Group, Women's Group, Daycare, Corner Shed for the children after school – it's all connected and working very well."

May and Myrtle are co-founders and current board members of PPAC and have been instrumental in saving the lives and improving the futures of many women and children in our community.

"When we first started out, we had women getting bashed up, and no other stronger people used to stand up and take women in. We used to take them in," May said.

"The main thing was about children and the wives – looking after them.

Drop in sometime, we would love to see you soon!




A planning meeting for Pormpuraaw's first attempt at holding a 'night market' will be held next Monday (2 November) at 10am in the PPAC Board Room.
