Financial counsellors help people with budgeting, saving and dealing with debts. They can also provide advice about Centrelink payments and basic tax questions.

Call Centrelink

If you receive a Centrelink payment, call Centrelink on 1800 136 380 and let them know when you receive your Stolen Wages payment, how much you received and about any major assets you have purchased with your payment.
